SUBMISSION CATEGORIES

- **Research papers:**
up to 5000 words
- **Work-in-progress papers:**
up to 2500 words

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Papers to be considered for regular conference presentation and proceedings should be submitted via the regular conference submission process. A. RESEARCH PAPERS

Papers should not exceed 5000 words. They should describe original research (practical or theoretical). Theoretical papers should provide an overview of area of research closely related to information retrieval and filtering in BIS. Practical papers can describe an implemented tool or service that contributes to the area of information retrieval and filtering.

B. WORK IN PROGRESS

Papers should not exceed 2500 words. They may present some aspects related to information retrieval and filtering and describe work that it is still in progress but its results may be interesting for a broader audience.
